Signature of the CWA Cooperation Working Arrangement between the Horizon Europe Partnership "2Zero" and Regione Piemonte (Italy)

On December 12th, 2024, Regione Piemonte Delegation in Brussels hosted the signing ceremony of the Cooperation Working Arrangement (CWA) between the Horizon Europe partnership "Towards Zero Emission Road Transport" (2Zero) and Regione Piemonte. The agreement aims to accelerate the transition towards zero-emission road mobility across Europe.

The co-programmed Horizon Europe partnership "Towards Zero Emission Road Transport" (2Zero) and Regione Piemonte strengthened their collaboration by signing a Cooperation Working Arrangement (CWA).

The CWA establishes a strategic cooperation umbrella to promote synergies among EU and regional funds, particularly Horizon Europe and ERDF. The agreement aims to align Piemonte's R&I priorities with 2Zero partnership's objectives, advancing zero-emission road transport and supporting climate, safety, and environmental goals, in line with the 2Zero Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda (SRIA).

The core of the Arrangement is to foster joint efforts to support parallel and sequential funding opportunities for innovation, training, and regional development, maximizing scientific, socioeconomic and environmental impact.

Promoting collaboration between European Union programs and regional initiatives is a shared priority for both 2Zero partnership and the European Commission, as it is key to achieving the transition to zero-emission mobility and the objectives of the European Green Deal. For Regione Piemonte, the first European region to formalize a Cooperation Working Arrangement with 2Zero partnership, this Arrangement represents a significant opportunity for synergies. It ensures the Piemonte ecosystem remains aligned with European targets and activities, strengthening its role as a key player in the evolution of European automotive strategies and the future of clean and sustainable road transport.

Background notes

The Horizon Europe Co-Programmed Partnership "2Zero":

The "Towards zero emission road transport" (2Zero) is a co-programmed Partnership funded under the Horizon Europe programme aiming at accelerating the transition towards zero tailpipe emission road mobility across Europe. Formally launched on 23rd June 2021, the 2Zero partnership builds upon the successes of the European Green Cars Initiative (EGCI: 2009-2013) and the European

Green Vehicles Initiative (EGVI: 2014-2020). With the support of five European Technology Platforms (i.e. ERTRAC, EPoSS, ETIP-SNET, ALICE and BATT4EU Horizon Europe coprogrammed partnership), 2Zero investigates innovative zero tailpipe emission vehicles technologies and their integration in the eco-system, contributing to boost the EU competitiveness and technological leadership.

Automotive Sector in Regione Piemonte:

Regione Piemonte is an Italian leading region for the automotive industry, with a robust and well-structured supply chain that accounts for more than 30 percent of national turnover in the sector.
